

V. Annexing Texas

A. American Settlements

- Role of Stephen F. Austin
 - a. Leader of United States settlers into the province of Texas (1821).
 - b. Settlers were promised fertile land to farm by the Mexican government.



B. American Settlements

- Mexican Edict Against Immigration
 - a. Population (30,000 Texans / 7 million Mexicans)
 - b. Between 1832-33 Texans demanded their own state
 - c. Texans rebelled in 1835 against Antonio Lopez de Santa Anna

B. American Settlements



- Antonio Lopez de Santa
 Anna's Actions
 - a. Assumed the power over the Mexican government in 1834.
 - b. Wanted tighter control over the government (including Texas).

C. Independence

Battle of the Alamo

- a. The site of a stand-off by 189 Texans against Santa Anna's army of over 4,000.
- b. The small Texas force were led by William Travis, Jim Bowie, and Davy Crockett.
- c. All in the Alamo were killed or executed.
- d. "Remember the Alamo" inspired Texans will to fight.




C. Independence (Cont'd...)

Role of Sam Houston

- a. Leader of the Texans in rebellion against Mexico.
- b. Organized an army to fight

 Santa Anna.
- c. Hero of the Battle of San Jacinto winning the rebellion.

D. Republic of Texas

- Sam Houston as President
 - a. Expansion west to the Pacific
 - b. Annexation efforts
- Efforts for Annexation

A. Election of 1844


- The Texas |ssue
 - a. Clay opposed annexation
 - b. Democratic Party abandoned Martin Van Buren
 - c. Supported the "dark horse" James K. Polk
- Clay v. Polk

A. Election of 1844

- Expansionists
 - a. Those favoring the growth of the United States by acquiring territory for expansion.
 - b. Generally were Southerners and Democrats.
- Non-Expansionists
 - a. Those against the United States acquiring territory for expansion.
 - b. Generally were Northerners and Whigs.



Domestic

 Opposed the creation of a new national bank and favored lowered tariffs.

Foreign

- Texas Joins the Union
 (1845)
- Acquired the Oregon
 Territory (1846)
- President during the
 Mexican War (1846—1848)

B. Posk in Office

- Polk's Background
 - a. North Carolinian to Tennessean
 - b. Opposed the bank and nationalist policies
 - c. Nicknamed "Young Hickory"

B. Posk in Office (Cont'd...)

- Polk's Program
 - a. Reduce the tariff
 - b. Establish an independent treasury
 - c. Settle Oregon
 - d. Acquire California
