A. *Battle of Chancellorsville*

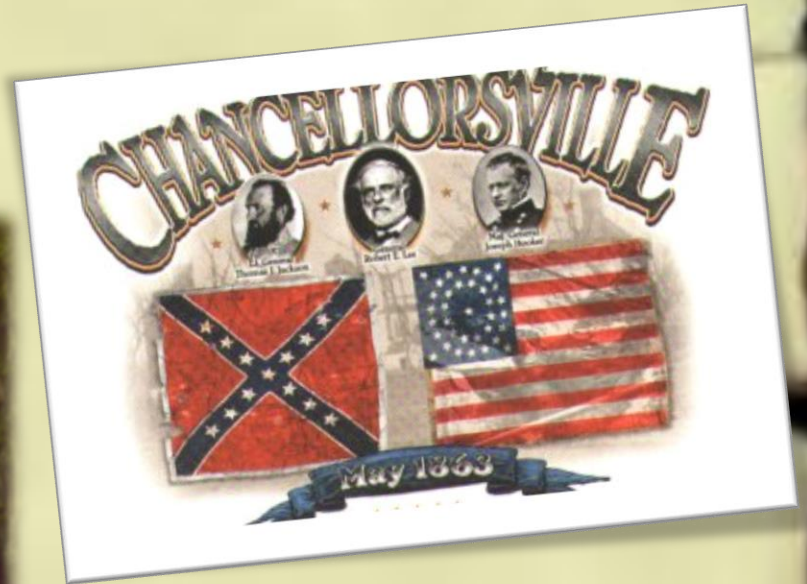
- Largest Union Army
- Death of Jackson
- Lee Defeats Hooker
 - a. Peak of Lee's Career
 - b. Lee's last major win

A. Battle of Chancellorsville

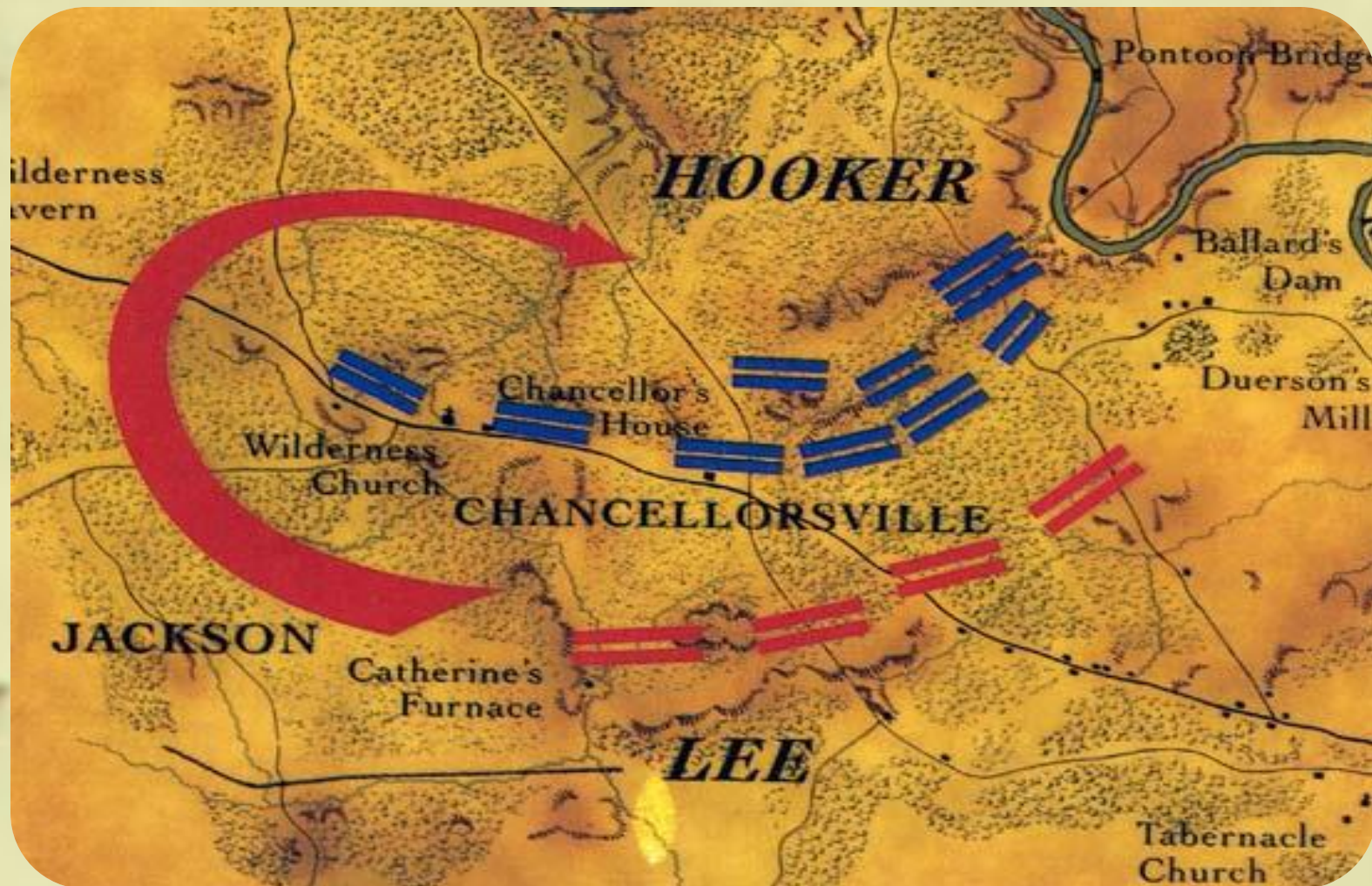
Battle of Chancellorsville (May, 1863)

- a. Lee (CSA) v. Hooker (USA).
- b. Confederate victory – Known as Lee's greatest victory.
- c. "Stonewall" Jackson shot by his own men and died.
- d. Hooker relieved of command – George G. Meade given command of Army of the Potomac.
- e. Lee decided to go North again – leads to the Battle of Gettysburg.

B. Grant's Vicksburg Victory

- Vicksburg (May - July 1863)
 - a. Pemberton (CSA) v. Grant (USA).
 - b. Union victory.
 - c. City surrendered on July 4th after a long siege -
Pemberton surrendered 30,000 men.
 - d. Completed Union strategy of splitting Confederacy
in two (last stronghold on Mississippi River).

B. Grant's Vicksburg Victory

- Vicksburg (May - July 1863)



C. Gettysburg

Battle of Gettysburg (July 1-3, 1863)

- Lee (CSA) v. Meade (USA).
- 3rd day – Pickett's Charge (13,000 men killed).
- Union victory – 51,000 casualties.
- Lee lost 1/3 of his army.
- Last Confederate offensive.
- Guaranteed no European recognition for Confederacy.

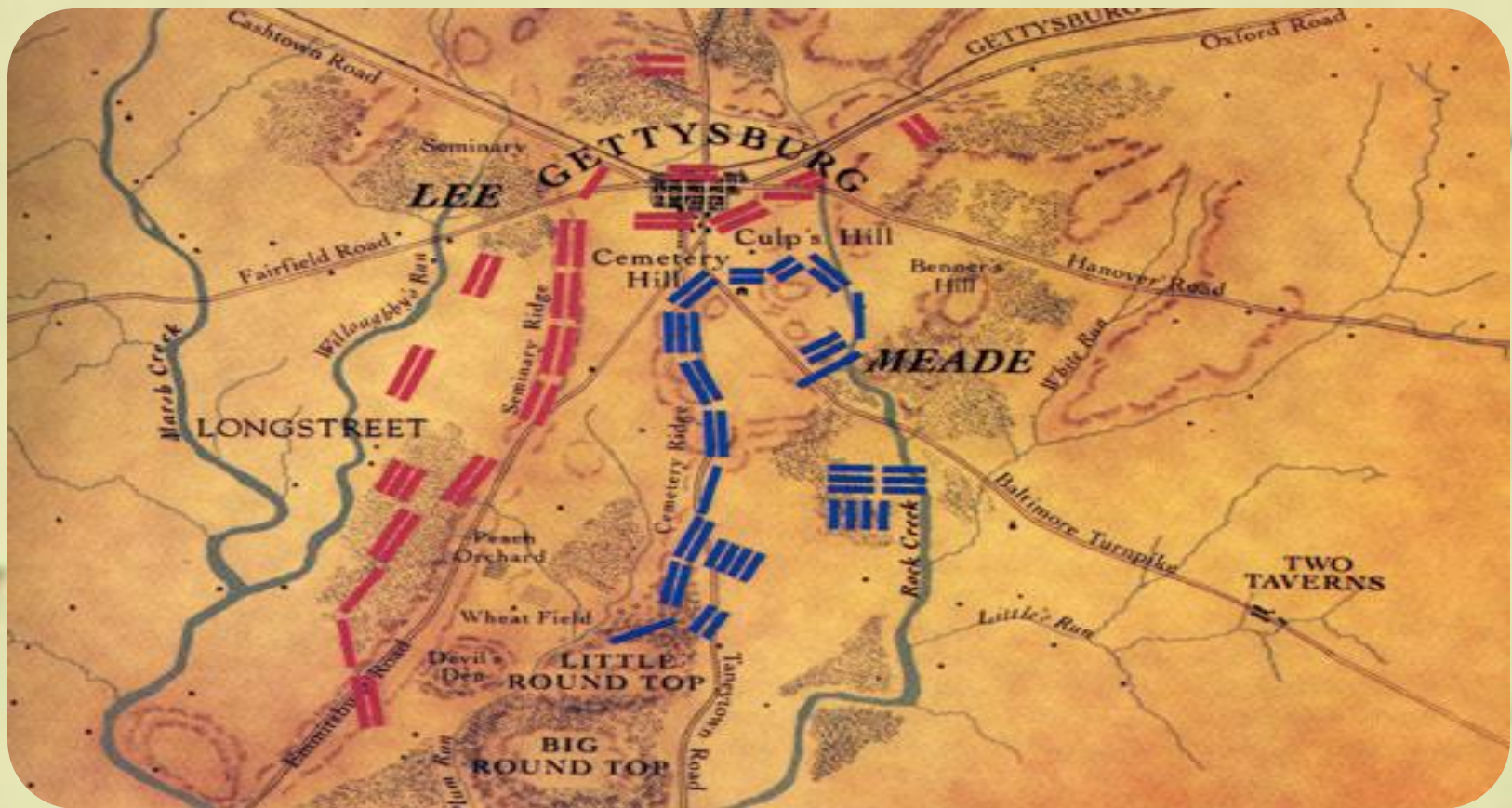

Battle of Gettysburg (July 1, 1863)



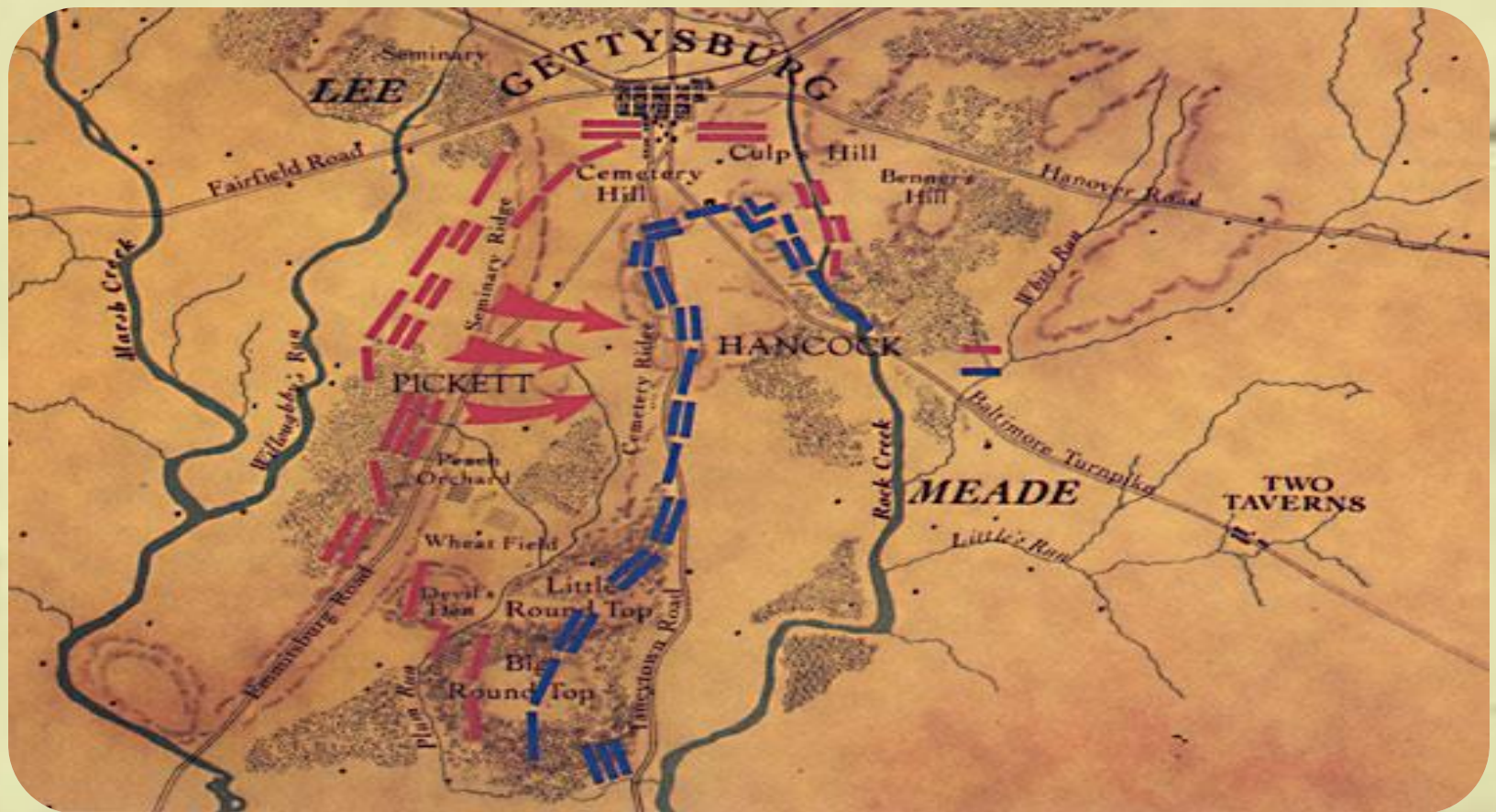
