- support system (who supported the explorations and establishment of colonies in the New World; e.g. royal, private enterprise, etc.)
- regional settlement and control of the New World
- relationship with indigenous populations (which indigenous groups did your nation encounter in explanation and colonization, and what type of commercial activity occurred)
- type of government established (e.g. assembly, military governor, etc.)
- successes and failures of the colonies established (discuss successes and failures that your nation experience)
